

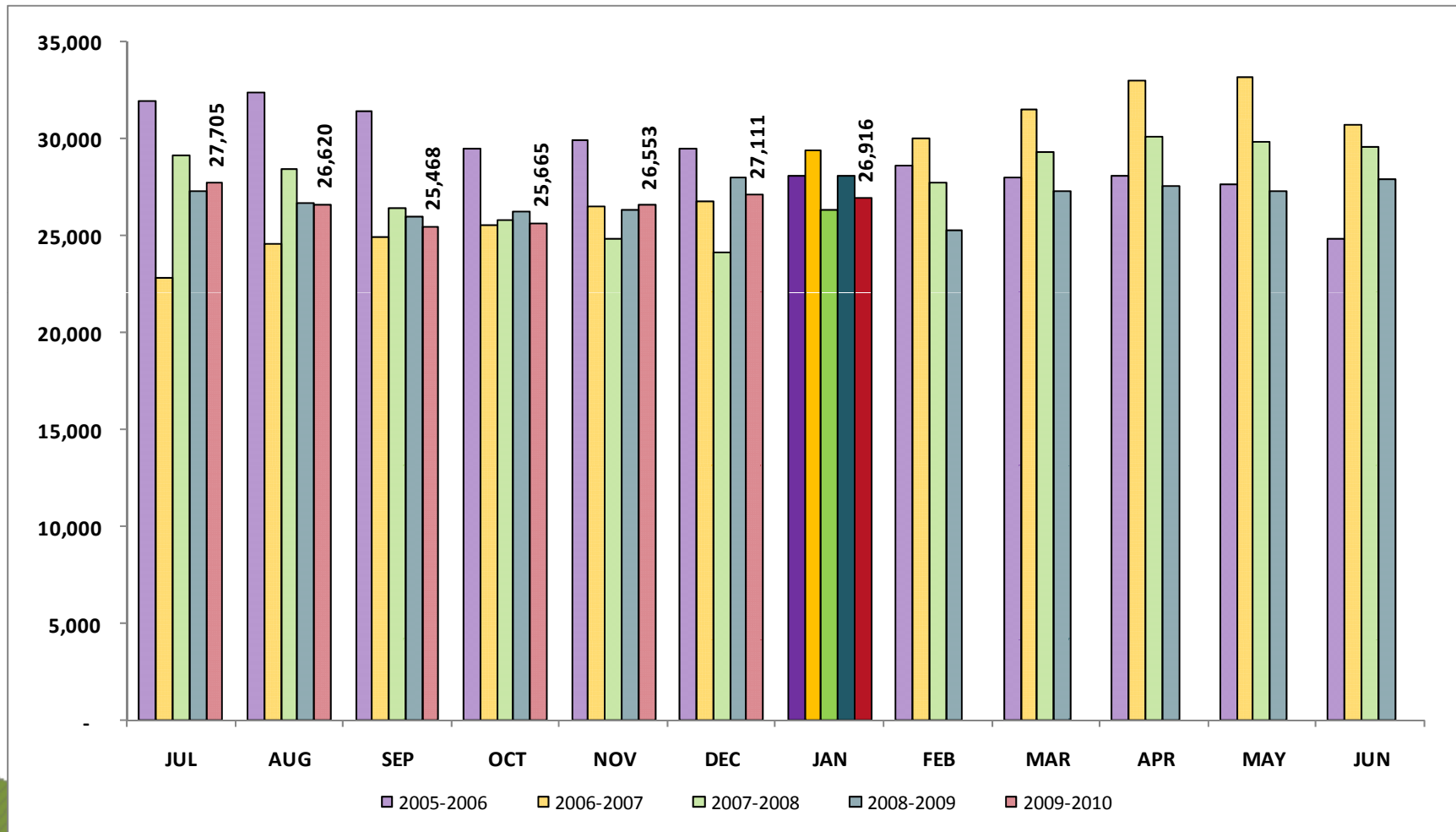

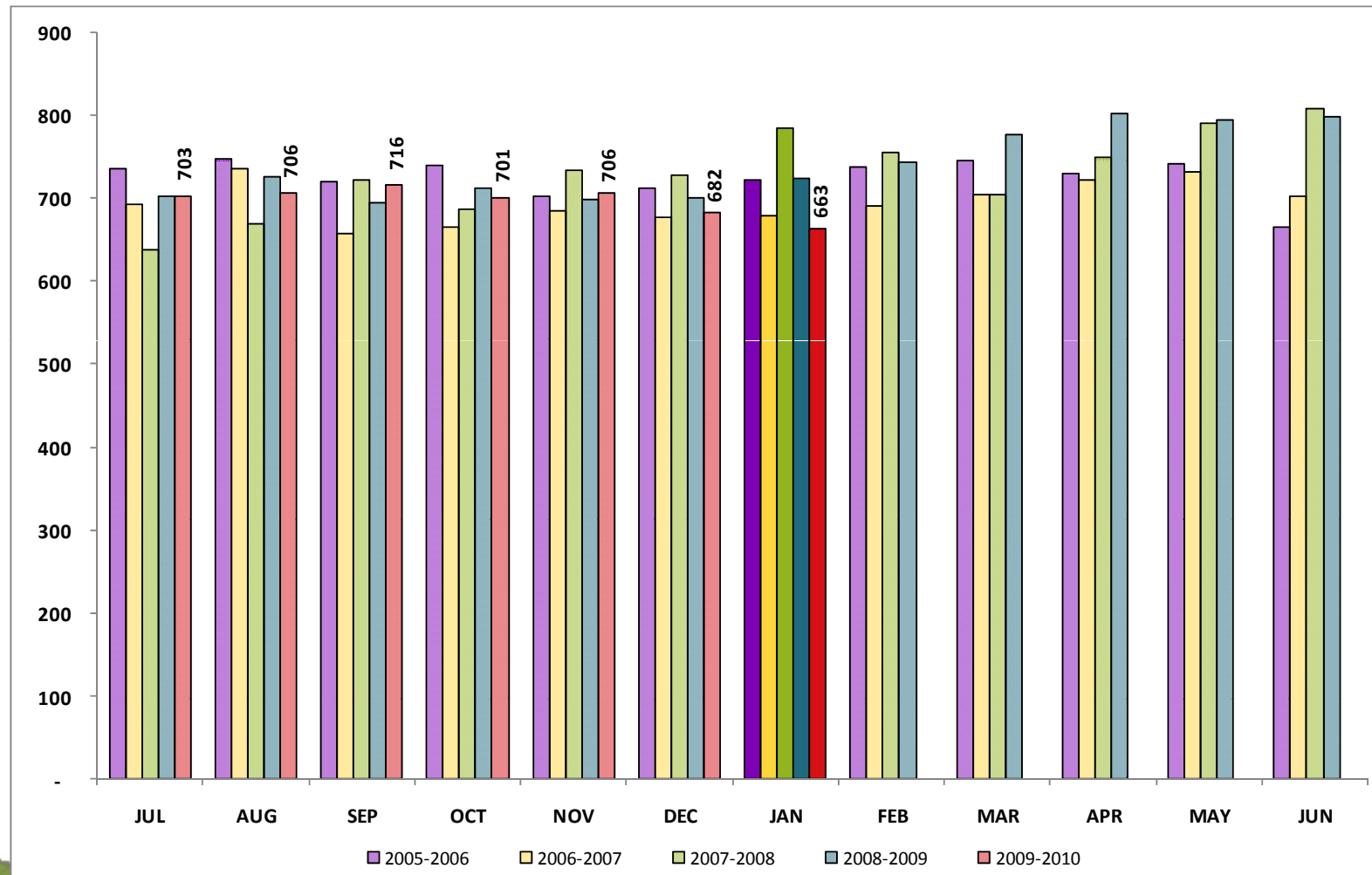
# School Readiness Paid: Miami-Dade

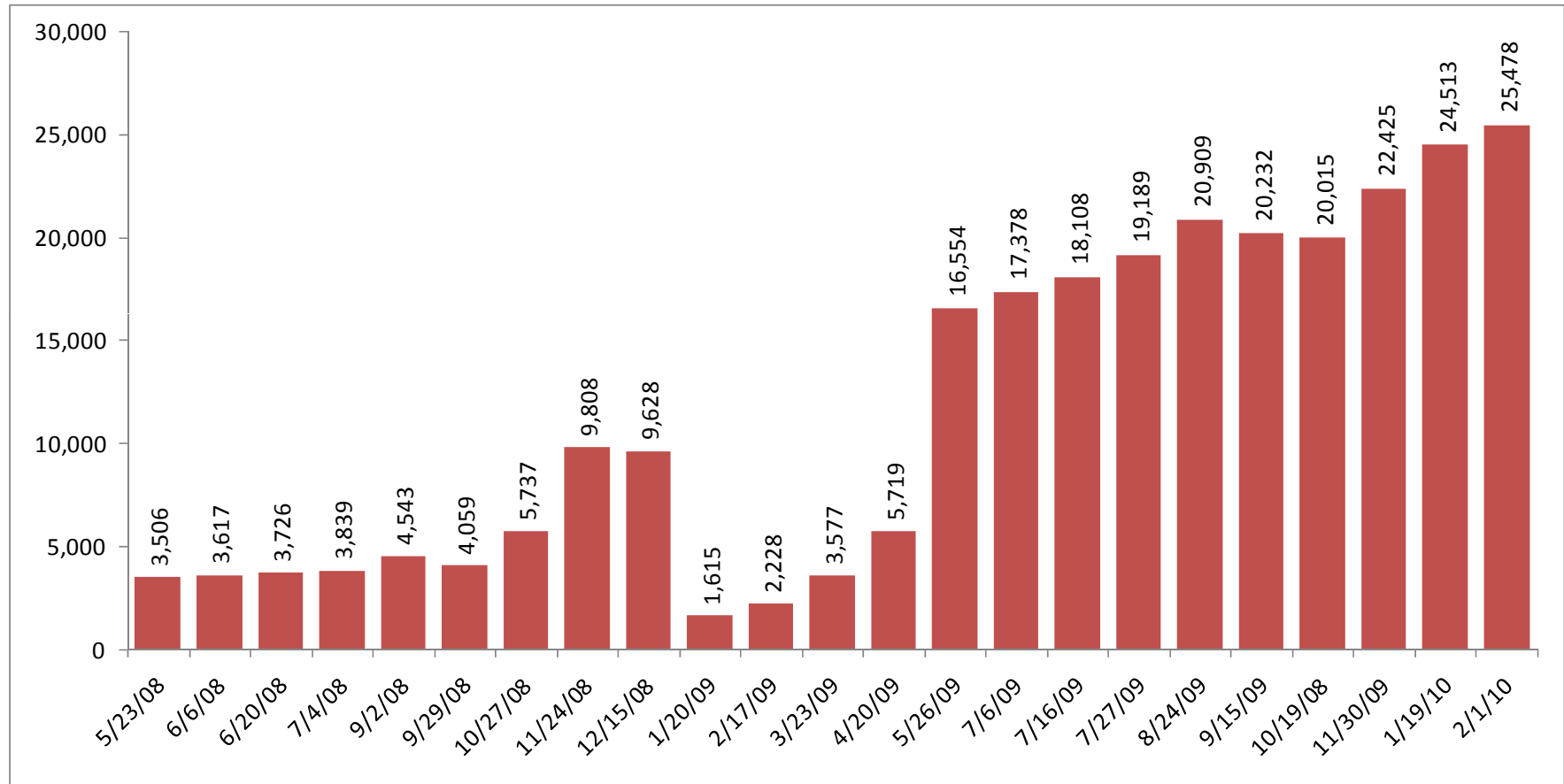
# School Readiness Paid: Monroe

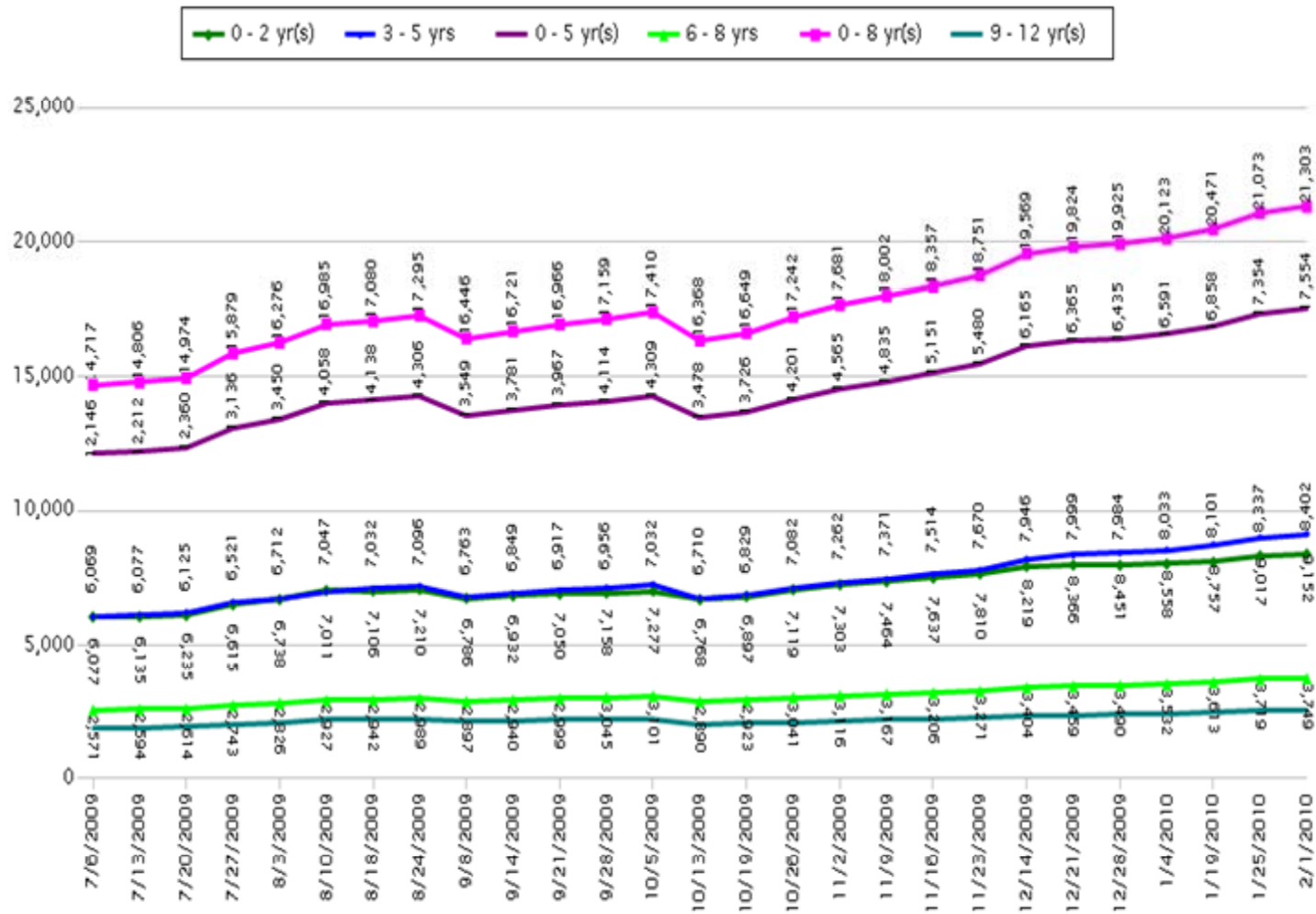
The waitlist includes children 0 to 12 and over

# School Readiness Wait List by Age Group Group: Miami-Dade

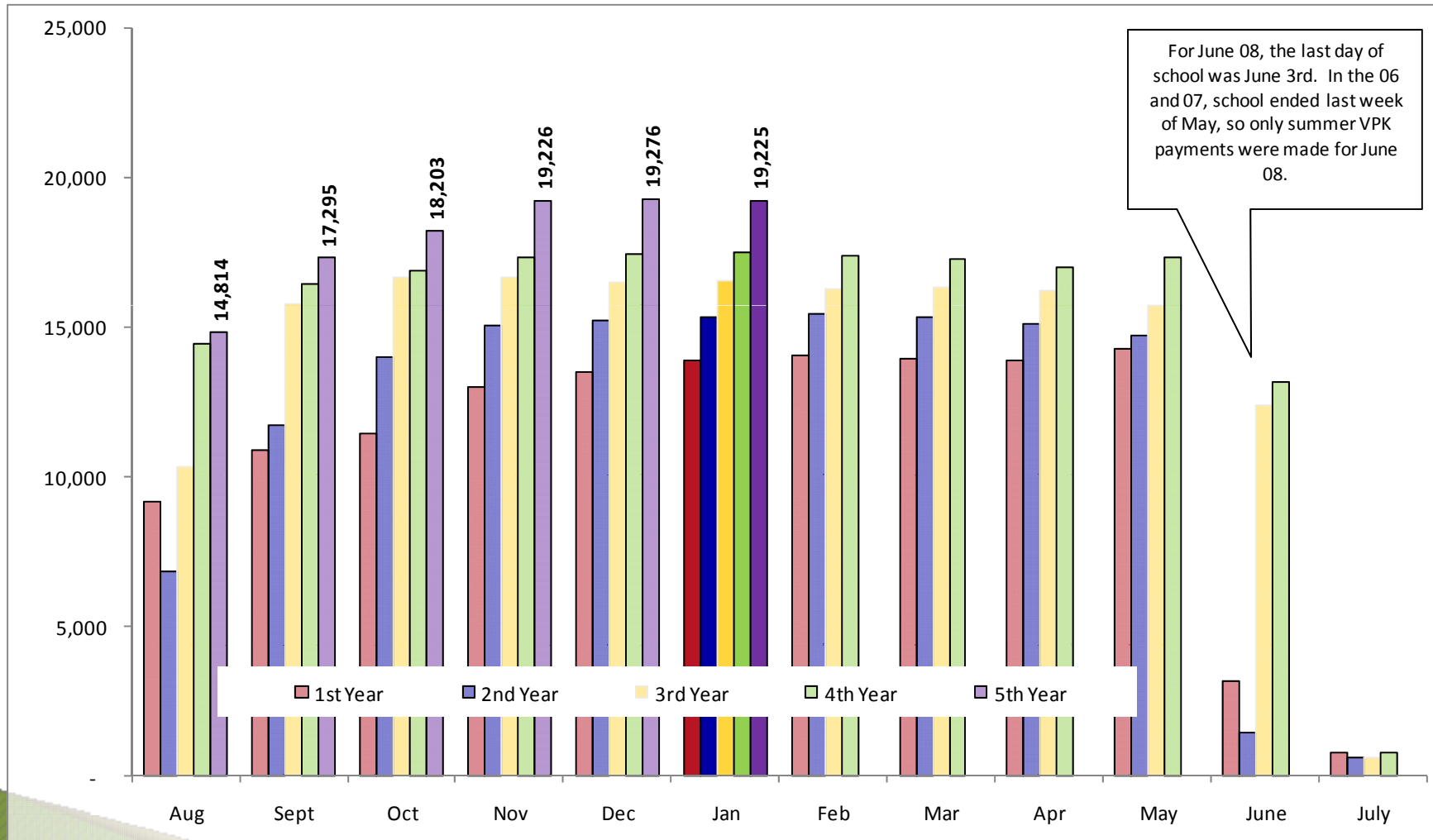


Waiting List by Age Group



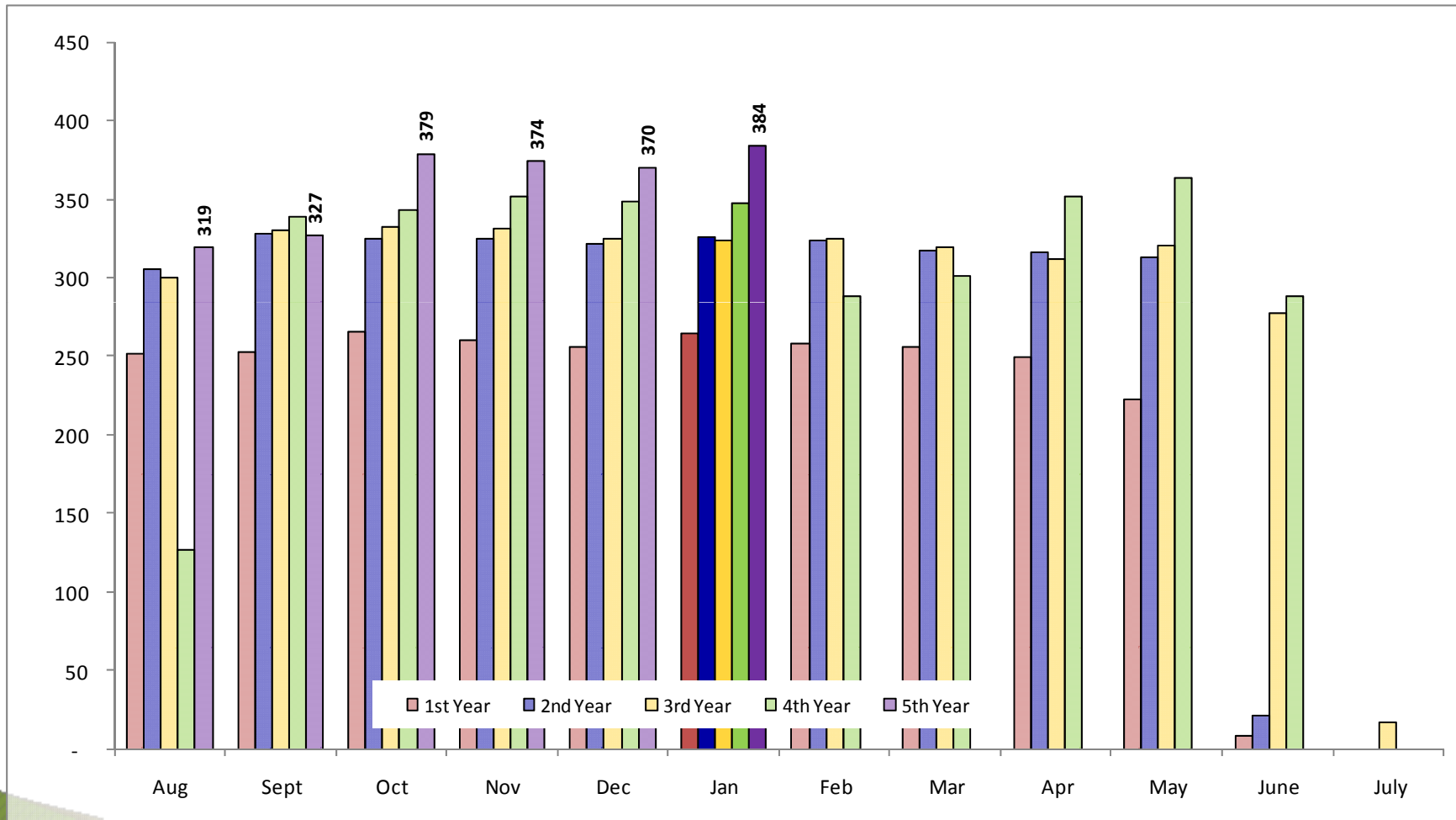

# VPK Paid: Miami-Dade



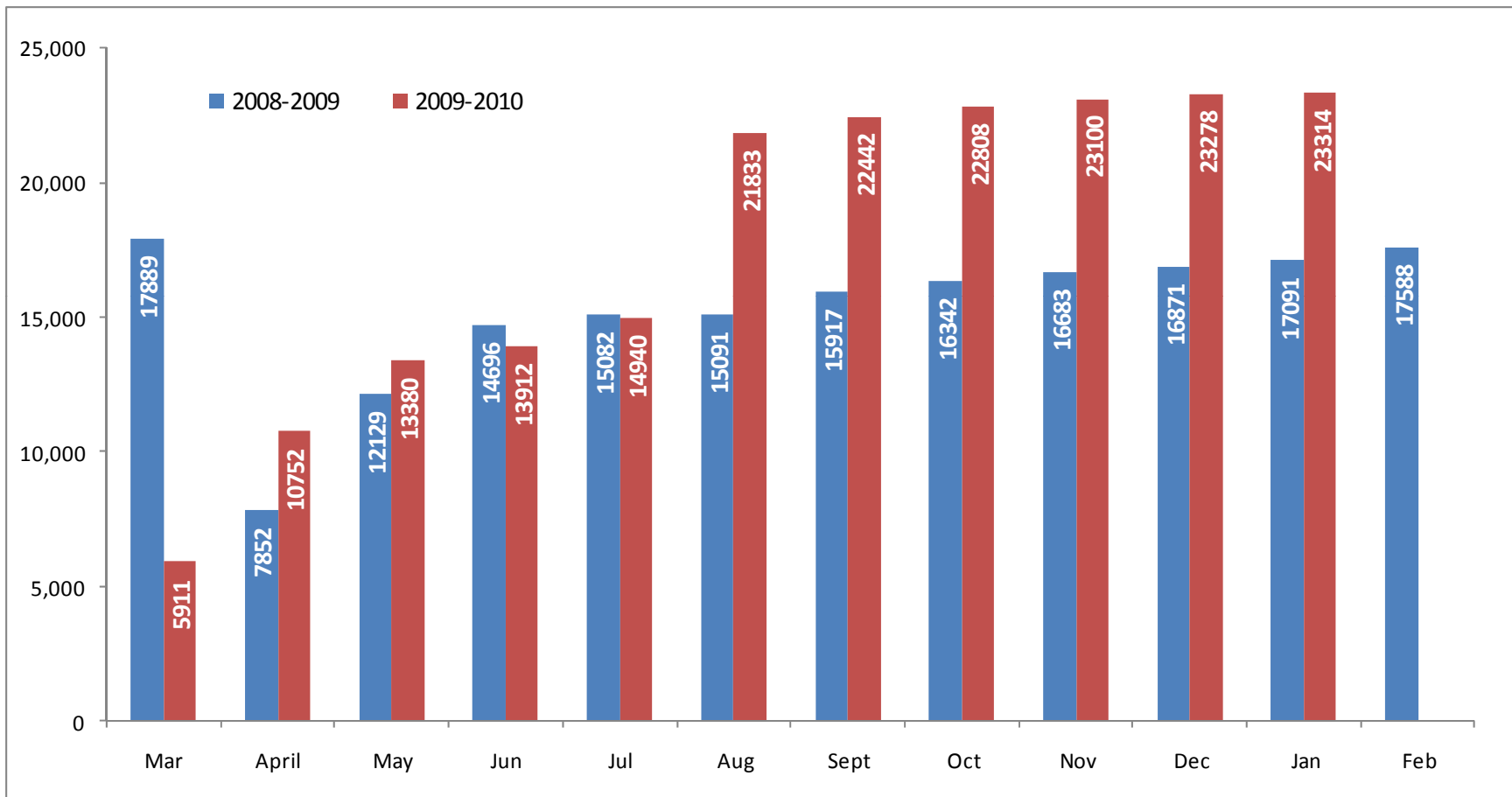

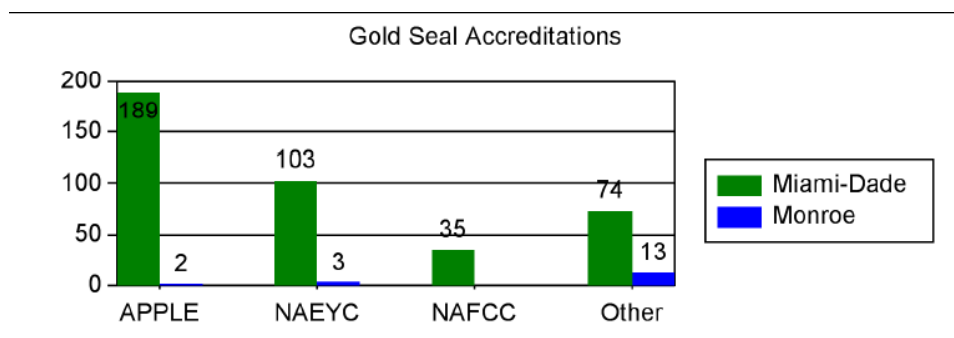

As of 2/18/2010 there are 401 Gold Seal Sites, an increase of 6 from last month. **Note that some sites have more than one accreditation above.**

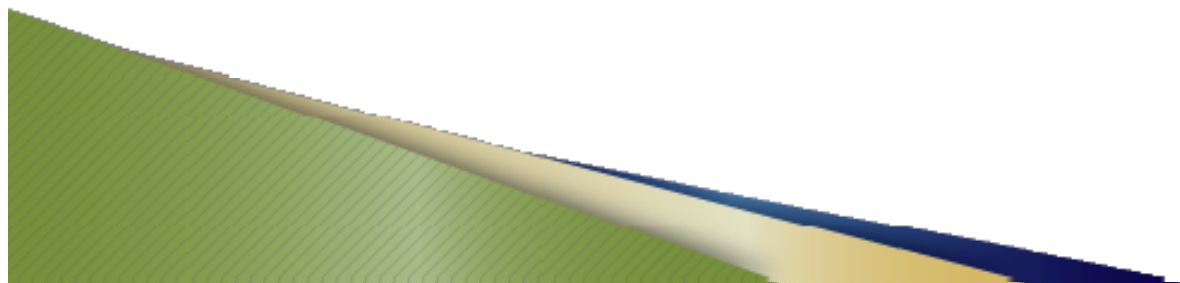

- IBM is planning to expand the program with coalitions statewide through the Association of Early Learning Coalitions



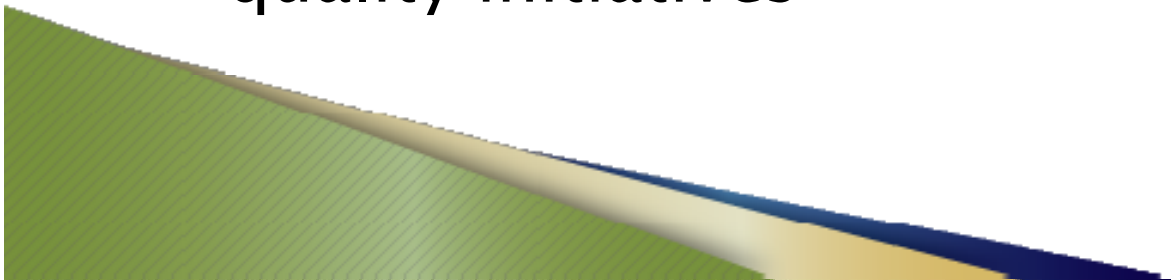
# Obama Administration Proposal Highlights for Child Care

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- **Impact of the Child Care Funds**

- Proposed \$1.6 billion increase would become part of the “baseline” of CCDBG funds, which is what ECEC and partners advocated to the Administration following the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) one-time investment
- The increase should serve as many as 235,000 children and address the quality of child care
- Funds will move through the existing CCDBG structures and states will have considerable flexibility about dollars for slots, rates, and quality initiatives



# Obama Administration Proposal Highlights for Child Care

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- **Next Steps**

- The Administration’s annual Budget Proposal is just that – a **proposal**, it is a guide to the Administration’s priorities, but it is not binding
- Each year the Administration puts together a “blueprint” for federal revenue and expenses for the next fiscal year
- The child care community will need to work strategically as advocates to keep these proposals intact
