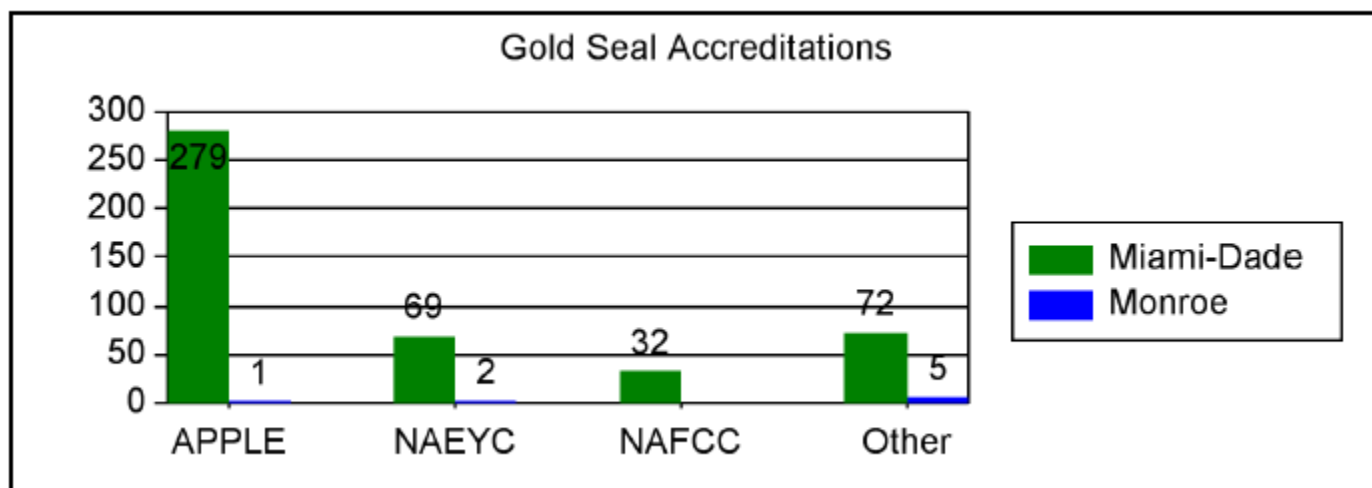

Miami-Dade/Monroe - Accredited Individual Sites

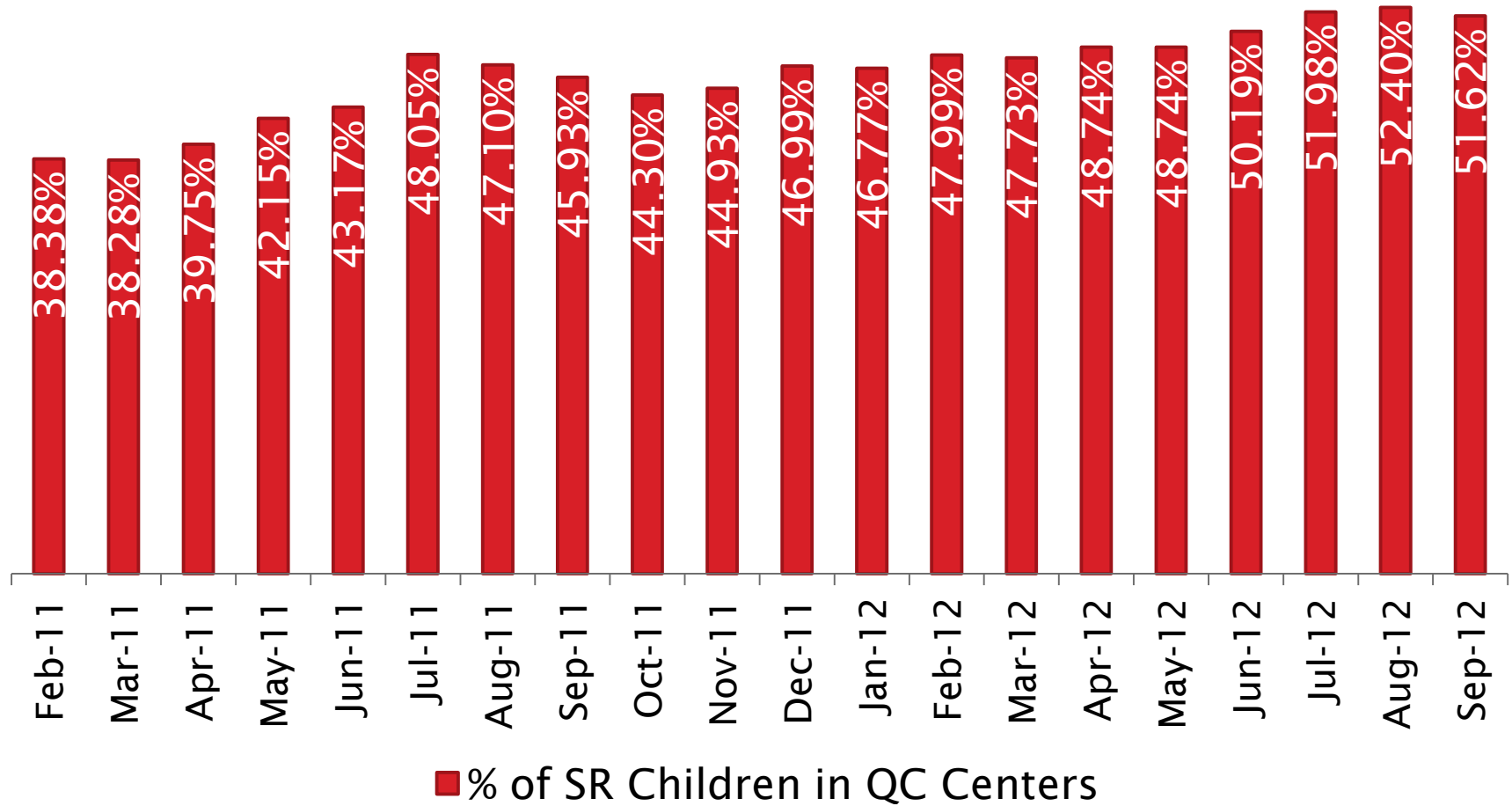

Miami-Dade/Monroe - Gold Seal Sites

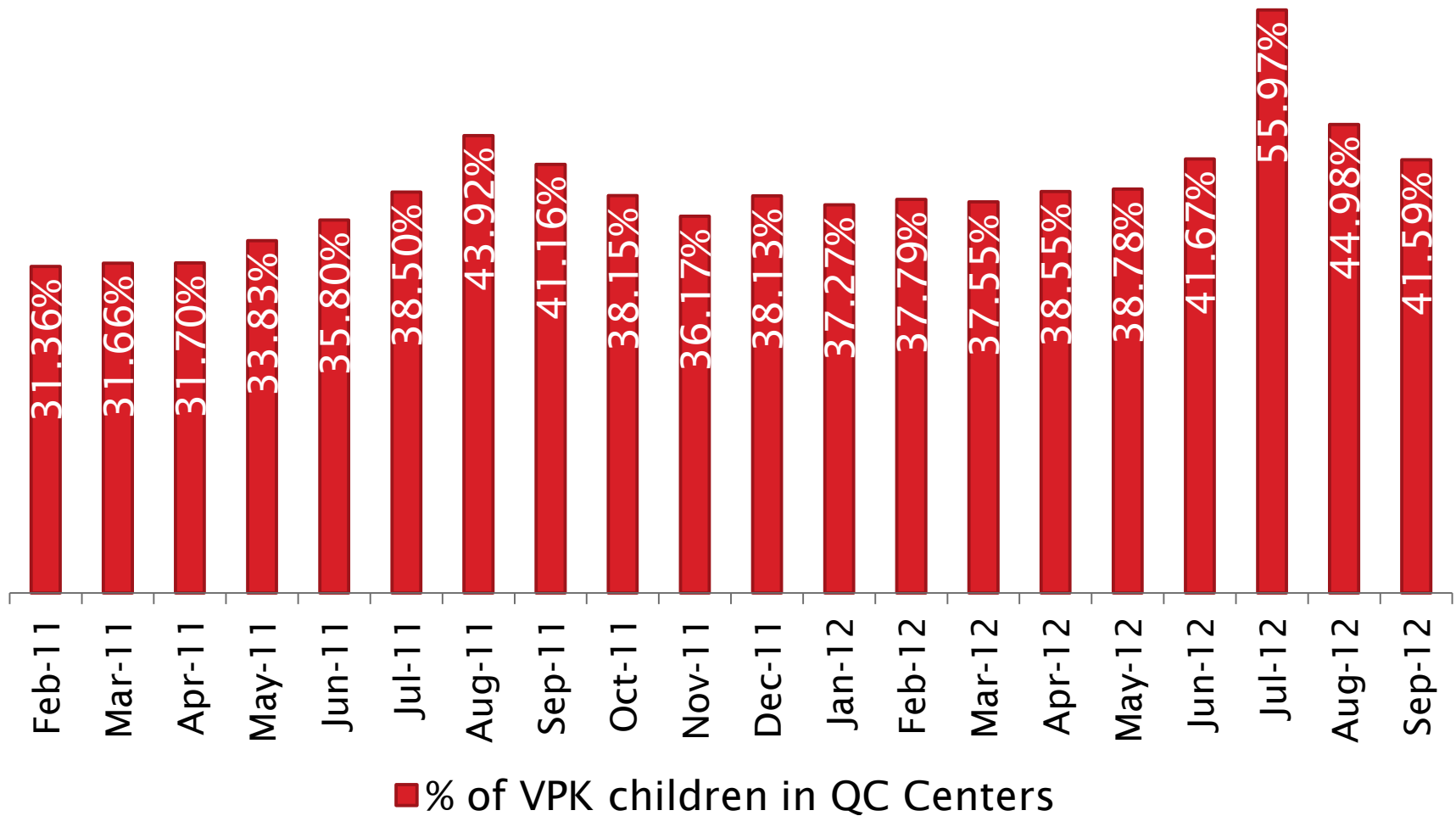

Federal Quality Performance Report (QPR)

- Guiding Principles
 - In FY 2012 for the first ever data collected is tied to Child Care Development Fund quality funds – it is an introductory baseline year
 - QPR's emphasis is reporting each State's progress on its child care quality improvement goals
 - Information collected in the QPR will align and build on existing child care quality improvement efforts
 - The QPR will provide an annual snapshot of quality indicators tied to the Office of Child Care framework for childcare quality improvement

Federal Quality Performance Report (QPR)

- **Quality Performance Report**

- The purpose of the report is to capture the progress being made by states on improving the quality of child care
- The report will provide a national assessment of progress toward improving the quality of child care, including:
 - A focus on program quality and child care workforce quality
 - Track annual progress toward meeting high quality indicators and benchmarks
 - Including those that states set for themselves in the CCDF plan and those that are of interest to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services in measuring CCDF program performance

Federal Quality Performance Report (QPR)

- **Quality Performance Report**

- The report collects data in relation to the four components of child care quality used as a quality framework.
 1. Ensuring health and safety of children through licensing and health and safety standards
 2. Establishing early learning guidelines
 3. Creating pathways to excellence for child care programs through program quality improvement activities
 4. Creating pathways to an effective, well-supported child care workforce through professional development systems and workforce initiatives

Lights on Afterschool



The Boys and Girls Club and Wesley House Family Services hosted the recent Lights on Afterschool event at Bayview Park, Key West. Children's Day



Children's Day at Bayview Park, Key West is the largest children's event of the year. The Monroe ELC's booth is very popular with the preschoolers. Sensory tables filled with colored rice, "insta snow" and water keep the children actively engaged in play. Parents are provided with helpful developmental guides and resources on services available through the ELC and our partners.

2012 – 2013 Klaus Murphy Foundation Grants

- **Services to Economically Disadvantaged Children, ages 0 – 5: \$15,005**
 - Grant funds are used as a **dollar-for-dollar match** to draw down state Child Care Executive Partnership (CCEP) funds
 - Child care assistance will be provided to approximately **seven (7) preschool children for a period of up to one year**
 - Klaus Murphy Foundation target service area is Key West – Stock Island
- **Services to Economically Disadvantaged Children, ages 5 – 9: \$13,736**
 - Grant funds are used as a **dollar-for-dollar match** to draw down state Child Care Executive Partnership (CCEP) funds
 - Child care assistance will be provided to approximately **ten (10) school age children for a period of up to one year**
 - Klaus Murphy Foundation target service area is Key West – Stock Island
- **Child Care Teacher Scholarship Project: \$3,457**
 - Grant funds are used to support the professional development of child care teachers in the Key West-Stock Island area
 - Current funds plus the remaining **fund balance from the prior year award totaling \$1,793** were utilized to make the 2012-2013 teacher scholarship awards
 - **Six (6) teachers received \$750 scholarships** each to enroll in the 10 month/120 hour Florida Child Care Professional (FCCPC) training program offered by Wesley House Family Services
 - **One (1) teacher** is pursuing an on-line FCCPC training program and will be reimbursed for expenses upon program completion (as approved by Klaus Murphy Foundation trustees)
