MyFloridaTray: Changes to Florida's School Lunch Menu

School lunch wasn't the tastiest for many of us growing up, let alone the healthiest. But Fresh for Florida Kids is trying to change that for our children. Approved to have started this school year, Florida school cafeterias are now required to meet new federal nutritional standards for school meals. According to the Fresh for Florida Kids website, these new standards are based on recommendations from the Institute of Medicine and follow the 2010 Dietary Guidelines for Americans.



School lunches must now meet the following standards:

- Age-appropriate calorie limits
- Larger servings of fruit and vegetables, including dark green and red/orange vegetables
- Fat-free or 1% milk (flavored milk must be fat-free)
- More whole grains
- Less sodium

The biggest changes Fresh for Florida Kids will encounter in the first year will be offering fruits and vegetables as two separate meal components every day and decreasing calories and sodium.

This new menu does not guarantee to be a hit with your children (we all know broccoli is not in the top picks for vegetables), but they will be receiving a better, more balanced meal.

In an effort to keep our beautiful city green, Miami-Dade County has launched the Miami-Dade Green <u>website</u>. The website has a variety of ways for you to conserve energy, water and other natural resources, because if we don't do it now, it might not be available in the future.

#### Here are a few things you'll find:

- Energy Tracking Tool: This is a free personal energy dashboard that helps track and analyze the energy usage in your home or business.
- Rebates and Incentives: There are many programs that can rebate a portion of an appliance purchase, such as an ENERGY STAR refrigerator, or exchange certain house items for more energy efficient ones, such as your bathroom showerhead or light bulbs.
- Living Green Programs: Such programs include the Environmentally Endangered Lands Program and the Every Drop Counts kids' poster contest.

# ReadingPals: An Early Literacy Initiative

Nearly a third of Florida's third graders attending public school cannot read at the minimally proficient levels. Sadly, those children are four times more likely to drop out of high school.

#### What is ReadingPals?

In an effort to ensure that more children are reading at grade level by the end of third grade, The Children's Movement of Florida and partners are excited to announce ReadingPals -- a three-year initiative focused on engaging, training and deploying volunteer "reading pals" in 10 Florida regions.



#### Who is involved in ReadingPals?

Partners include The Children's Movement, local United Ways, school districts, Women's Leadership Councils, Early Learning Coalitions, and Children's Services Councils among others. Together, the partners focus on improving the reading abilities of students from prekindergarten to third grade in lower-performing schools.

# Where is this initiative taking place?

ReadingPals is being launched in 10 Florida regions through local United Ways, including Miami-Dade County.

#### How can you get involved?

Volunteers are needed in each of the 10 regions for one hour per week (for at least 25 weeks) to read in individual or small group settings. Volunteers will be trained and provided background screenings before entering the program. The one hour volunteers give each week will have an effect that lasts a lifetime.
