Miami-Dade County Parks Offer Winter Break Camp

While your children are looking forward to days off school and the holiday season, you are probably wondering who will watch over them during the winter break. Luckily, Miami-Dade County Parks will be offering reasonable winter break camps and activities from Dec. 24, 2012, through Jan. 4, 2013.

Activities include sports, arts and crafts, games and field trips. Age groups also vary between activities and programs, but can range from 4 to 16 years of age.

The cost can also vary from \$40 a week to \$90 a week, and financial assistance is available to those who qualify.

Parents may register their child by visiting the specific Miami-Dade County Park they wish their child to attend. For a listing of participating parks by region you may click <u>here</u>. You may also register online using their online reservation system.



- Remember the Three A's of Crime Prevention: Be AWARE of your Surroundings, be ALERT of suspicious people and vehicles, and AVOID dangerous situations.
- Avoid displaying valuables, such as jewelry.
- Zip or close purses and bags, and if possible, leave purses and bags at home. A wallet or credit card is less tempting for a theft.
- Always park in well lighted areas
- If confronted by a carjacker, remember to choose life over property.
- If possible, try to find a babysitter for your children.
- At home, do not display all your gifts by windows or doorways.
- If buying a real Christmas tree, check it regularly for freshness and green needles.
- Turn off all electrical lights and decorations before leaving home or going to be bed.
