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President's Message



Dear Friends:

We thank you for participating in Read for the Record on October 27, 2016. Miami-Dade and Monroe Counties had more than 7,700 readers and the Early Learning Coalition distributed more than 4,000 copies of "A Bear Ate Your Sandwich." In partnership with the Miami-Dade Public Library System, the Early Learning Coalition of Miami-Dade/Monroe announced its "Talking is Teaching: Talk, Read, Sing" initiative in conjunction with Read for the Record. Our Talking is Teaching: Talk, Read, Sing project is now in full swing. In addition to our partnership with Univision's Pequeños y Valiosos, now, all callers to 211™ Switchboard hear helpful tips for promoting literacy in children. Additionally, tote bags with books and child-

sized clothing items are being distributed to new moms at Holtz Children's Hospital and to families who visit Jackson Health's four community clinics and seven federally qualified health centers partnering with the Healthy Start Coalition of Miami-Dade.

Be sure to stop by your local public library branch where you'll find a wealth of "Talk, Read, Sing" information including posters, bookmarks, tip sheets and books that you and your family can personalize at home. This ongoing initiative highlights Miami as a "talking is teaching" city where increased communication through every day activities produces socio-emotional bonds and the tools to facilitate long-term educational success.

On October 30, 2016, the Early Learning Coalition celebrated Children's Day in Key West. Staff from the Key West office engaged dozens of families, distributed information, led sensory activities and provided books to many of the children who attended.

In the month of November, we continue our community outreach, in-depth trainings through the Professional Development Institute and more. The Early Learning Coalition will promote early literacy and reading with the Miami Book Fair, a signature event where staff engage parents, families and early education providers via our information booth and "Tot Lot" tent. Community partners will join us to create interactive activities for families and children. We invite you to join us Friday, November 18, 2016.

As we turn to the holiday season, we welcome you on November 17, 2016 to experience one of our monthly cafés. This month's theme is "Re-imagining Thanksgiving." This café features a courtesy lunch sponsored by Kaplan Early Learning Company and will be an opportunity to share your voice as to how you came to the "American Table". As always, the community is welcome to join us for these powerful discussions.

WHAT IS HIPPY?

HIPPY is a parent involvement and school readiness program. The Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) program offers FREE home-based early childhood education for three and four year old children working with their parent(s) as their first teacher. The parent is provided with a trained Parent Educator, a set of 30 developmentally appropriate activities, and 9 books designed to strengthen their children's cognitive skills, early literacy skills, social/emotional and physical development.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

HIPPY begins with the basic tenet that all parents want the very best for their children. HIPPY gives parents the tools, skills and confidence they need to support their child's potential. HIPPY teaches parents how to engage their children in educational activities. HIPPY delivers services through home visits by trained Parent Educators from the community. HIPPY provides additional learning experiences through group meeting activities and special events.

SCHOOL READINESS

HIPPY is primarily cognitive based focusing on language development, problem solving, logical thinking and perceptual skills. HIPPY's curriculum covers the skills necessary to build emergent literacy skills. HIPPY's curriculum is evidence based and builds on the child's interests and maturing skills.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Must be a parent or guardian of Monroe or Collier county with a child age 3 or 4. Available for weekly one hour home visits with trained Parent Educators. TANF eligible and/or receiving School Readiness funding.
